She is currently the **Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Students' and Alumni Affairs)** at (The National University of Malaysia) since February 1st, 2014 until 31st January 2018.

She is very active in community works and been appointed as Chairperson of the Muslim Women Consultative Council Malaysia (MPWIM) YADIM since July 1st 2013 and was a President of Academic Staff Association of UKM from year 2009 until 2014. She is also an active Executive Council of the International Society of Family Law, New York. She also been appointed as Resource person to SUHAKAM (Human Rights Commissions of Malaysia), Resource person and committee member of the Family Law Research Unit of The Institute of Islamic Understanding Malaysia (IKIM), Advisor to the Editorial Board of Jurnal Kanun, Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka, Panel Assessor to Malaysia Quality Agency (MQA) and Panel Advisor on Syariah Law for the Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development of Malaysia.

Currently, she's been appointed as **Panel Member for Majlis Perundingan Islam (MPI) Malaysia, Council Member for Islamic Rely Council of Negeri Sembilan (MAINS)** and **Fellow at CENTHRA (Centre for Human Rights Research and Advocacy)**. She is the author of '**Punishment for Child Offenders** (Berkeras Patah Berlembut Lentur – Perintah Bagi Pesalah Kanak-Kanak)' in 2014, '**Women and Law** (Wanita dan Undang-Undang)' in 2006 and '**Introduction to Malaysia Legal System** (Pengenalan Kepada Sistem Perundangan di Malaysia)' in 2003 and many more.

She has regularly been invited for TV Programmes since 2013 until now. Currently she runs a live radio program 'Dari Hati' twice a month with Radio IKIM and it's an interactive program on issue of women, children and family.
