Workshop on Promoting IP Commercialisation in a Knowledge-based Economy

IP commercialisation plays a critical part in fostering economic growth of ASEAN Member States and is a long-term policy to be implemented in stages. To enhance the capacities of ASEAN, the Intellectual Property Department (IPD) of Hong Kong, China organised a 1-day virtual workshop on Promoting IP Commercialisation in a Knowledge-based Economy on 2 December 2022 to share Hong Kong, China's best practices of enterprises in managing IP assets to enhance IP protection, R&D capacity and technology transfer and to enable effective commercialisation, driving the development of a creative and R&D based economy. The Workshop is one of the AHKFTA ECOTECH Work Programme projects approved by the AHKFTA Joint Committee in 2022.

The workshop successfully provided a platform for IP commercialisation stakeholders to share knowledge and experiences from ASEAN and Hong Kong, China. The workshop also provided the ASEAN participants with a valuable opportunity to share and exchange experiences in promoting IP commercialisation and IP trading. The participants had the chance to learn about the financial and legal regulatory frameworks in various economies, how technology companies created business values in the region and the latest development of the technology transfer bodies. Ultimately, with this knowledge exchange, further collaboration on IP commercialisation to drive economic growth could be explored.

Noting the success of the event, IPD indicated that it would hold thematic workshops related to IP for ASEAN to be held at the sidelines of the Business IP Asia Forum held annually in December. Future workshops may be arranged to focus on sharing the difficulties and problems encountered by ASEAN at various implementation stages.
