1. Entry Restrictions of Foreign Nationals

QUARANTINE COVID-19

- Permitted or invited by the PM or under a special arrangement with a foreign country
- Diplomatic missions (+ spouse, parents or children)

14 days

- Carriers of necessary goods and crew members
- Having residence certification (+ spouse, parents or children)

- Obtaining work permit (+ spouse or children)
- Students of educational institutions approved by Thai authorities (+ guardians)
- Seeking medical treatment (+ attendants)



1. Entry Restrictions of Foreign Nationals

The documentation needed prior to entry to Thailand Health certificate showing negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test results

Fit to Fly Certificate

Certificate of Entry (COE) issued by the Thai embassy or consulate

Health Insurance covering COVID-19 (not less than 100,000 USD)

Letter of approval on quarantine accommodation by the Thai authorities

Post-quarantine accommodation details

Class style




Most of the universities use a blended plan for the degree programmes.


